CONFIDENTIALITY STATEMENT

We at Basketball Northern Ireland will never promise to keep secrets. However, information of a confidential nature will only be communicated on a "need to know" basis, with the welfare of the child paramount.

Considerations of confidentiality will not be allowed to override the rights of children or young members to be protected from harm. (see appendix 9)

A full Safeguarding policy statement should be displayed and available within club premises for all interested parties to read.

The following points should be kept in mind:

- A guarantee of confidentiality or undertakings regarding secrecy cannot be given, as the welfare of the child will supersede all other considerations
- All information should be treated in a careful and sensitive manner and should be discussed only with those who need to know
- Giving information to others on a 'need to know' basis for the protection of a child is not a breach of confidentiality
- All persons involved in a child protection process (the child, his/her parents/guardians, the
 alleged offender, his/her family, Sports Leaders) should be afforded appropriate respect,
 fairness, support and confidentiality at all stages of the procedure.
- Information should be stored in a secure place, with limited access only to designated people
- The requirements of the Data Protection laws should be adhered to
